

Dr. Susan Cutter, Carolina Distinguished Professor and director of the Hazards and Vulnerability Research Institute at the University of South Carolina, received her B.A. from California State University, East Bay and her M.A. and Ph.D. (1976) from the University of Chicago. She has authored or edited fourteen books, including *Emergency Management in the 21st Century: From Disaster to Catastrophe* (co-edited with Claire B. Rubin, 2020), published more than 150 peer-reviewed articles and book chapters and mentored more than 50 masters and doctoral students.

Dr. Cutter led field teams to study long term recovery from Hurricane Katrina (2005), Hurricane Sandy (2012), the October 2015 South Carolina floods, and Hurricane Matthew (2016). She served on the US Army Corps of Engineers IPET post-Katrina team, and was a juror for the Rebuild by Design competition for Hurricane Sandy reconstruction.

Dr. Cutter chaired the National Academies committee that authored the 2012 seminal report, *Disaster Resilience: A National Imperative*. She is an elected Fellow of AAAS, appointed as a MunichRe Foundation Chair on Social Vulnerability, recipient of American Association of Geographers (AAG) Lifetime Achievement, Presidential Achievement, and Wilbanks Award for Transformation Research. She received an honorary doctorate from Norwegian University of Science and Technology in Trondheim, Norway and was elected as a foreign member of the Royal Norwegian Society of Sciences and Letters.
